Trails & Views Forever

\$1,000,000 NEEDED DONATE NOW!

Created to tackle the crucial improvement and maintenance needs at Parkway recreational areas, the Trails & Views Forever program can begin making an immediate impact on the park thanks to you. A multi-year initiative with a \$3 million final goal, Trails & Views Forever is launching new projects. With your support, overlooks will be restored, trails will be repaired, and new signs will be installed to improve understanding of the park. This year's projects include:

BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, People of Color) Conservation Corps Trail Crew (\$54,400 needed)

You can give eight young adults a once-in-a-lifetime outdoor experience. Through a collaboration with the Conservation Corps of North Carolina (CCNC), your gift will provide trail restoration training and additional support for the crew. The team will spend 14 weeks rehabilitating the Tanawha Trail near Julian Price Memorial Park. The project is designed to give young adults the opportunity to work side by side with National Park Service employees; engage with visitors and the agency's supporters; and be part of a

personally and professionally empowering adventure. Participants will also receive college credit and preferred hiring status with federal land management agencies.

Craggy Gardens Exhibits (\$6,204 needed)

Craggy Gardens, known for its fantastic long-range views, is one of the most visited destinations on the Parkway. Your gift will create outdoor exhibits near the visitor center to provide directions and highlight the diverse natural resources of the high-elevation site.

Volunteer Support (\$11.500 needed)

With a gift, you can provide the supplies, training, and tools volunteers need to repair, rejuvenate, and improve multiple sites along the Parkway.

Viewshed Restoration (\$10.000 needed)

With your help, arborist crews can continue to restore the Parkway's famous overlooks. Your support will allow a highly trained crew to clear overgrown vegetation at designated vistas this fall.

Waterrock Knob Exhibits (\$28.667 needed)

The Waterrock Knob Visitor Center offers an introduction to the natural beauty, wildlife, and history of the southern end of the Parkway. Unfortunately, most of the indoor exhibits are faded, worn, and no longer accurate. We need your help to create new, interactive displays highlighting wildlife, mountain geology, birds, wildflowers, and the rich cultural history of the Eastern Band of Cherokee who still call the area home.

Wildlife Camera Project (\$5,460 needed)

Motion-activated cameras are a powerful tool for Parkway biologists studying wild rewithin the park. With a gift, you allow hid a cro-long project to continue and in pranteers and staff in deepening the understanding of magnificent animals within the national park.

Rock Castle Home Documentary (\$5,000 needed)

The Parkway's history is often wrapped up in what came before the creation of the park. The

documentary, *Rock Castle Home*, by Duke University Professor Charles Thompson Jr., shares the stories of descendants of a 1930s mountain community in Virginia. Outdoor Guide (\$12,131 needed)

Printed annually, the *Blue Ridge Parkway Outdoor Guide* features trail maps, safety information, and adventures. It is an essential resource for a well-planned Parkway excursion. With your support, the guide will be updated with new information and made available at visitor centers for free.
