N early every week, I drive past the glories of such places as Rocky Knob, Mabry Mill, and Groundhog Mountain, cruising around gentle curves hewn out of the forest along the crest of these old mountains, and I am ever reminded of the grand vision its architects had for this most popular unit of the National Park system.

Working with the Blue Ridge Parkway Foundation has been a joy

for me. Its dedicated staff and the cleareyed determination of its leaders have helped us do great things and contemplate many more. The reach of this organization is impressive—not just the fine work it does along the 469 miles of this elongated park, but in so many other places as well, such as the visionary Kids in Parks program that has added trails across the country, or the jaw-dropping plans for Moses H. Cone Memorial Park.

So when I drive the Parkway and see overlook after overlook overgrown with trees that block once-magnificent views, when I bounce over potholes north of Roanoke and south of Cumberland Knob, I try to remember that plans are underway


GREETINGS

Construction of the Blue Ridge Parkway began 19 years after the National Park Service was founded in 1916, and today it is the most visited national park unit in the country. That speaks volumes about the admiration we all have for a road that represents our cultural connections, love for the outdoors, and spirit of adventure.

During the Park Service's centennial year, our Community of Stewards continued to support the special places that dot this wondrous mountain landscape. An outpouring of support set Moses H. Cone Memorial Park on a path to reclaiming its former glory. Interpreters at Polly Woods Ordinary, Johnson Farm, and Ramsey Cabin can once again welcome visitors to these historic

landmarks thanks to the completion of structural repairs. And partnerships yielded a new pedestrian bridge at Julian Price Memorial Park.

This year, perhaps more than any other, we celebrated the Parkway with meaningful social events—the first annual Denim Ball to support Moses H. Cone Memorial Park and the Find Your Pint beer series, among others.

Our Kids in Parks program branched out with its first Citizen Science Trail and launched its TRACK Rx program that empowers doctors to prescribe outdoor exercise for the health of young patients.

In addition to a stellar season of summer concerts, the Blue Ridge Music Center hosted more than 2,000 music lovers during A Show for Joe: The Joe Wilson Memorial Music Festival.

As you flip through the pages, what we hope most of all is that you see your commitment to the Parkway reflected in these achievements, because they wouldn't be possible without you.

STEWARDSHIP in Action

Peaks of Otter

This year, the completion of major initiatives at Peaks of Otter Recreation Area, milepost 87, ensured two landmarks will survive to tell the stories of the people who lived here long before the Parkway was built. Polly Woods Ordinary, a former inn and tavern for travelers in the 1800s, underwent an extensive rehab that included rechinking the logs and new side gables and a roof. Before recent repairs, the barn at Johnson Farm was off limits to visitors because of concerns about its stability. Now this key asset will continue to shed light on early 20th century farm life in the mountains. Smaller outbuildings were also reroofed. Both projects were made possible thanks to funding from the 2015 Centennial Challenge, which paired funds designated by Congress with those of Foundation donors in honor of the National Park Service's 100th anniversary. The investment, including the repaving of Abbott Lake Trail, totaled \$334, 598.

Protecting Historic Landmarks



Doughton Park Picnic Area

Enjoying a picnic amid the bucolic setting of Doughton Park, milepost 241, is even more pleasant thanks to the installation of dozens of new tables at the Bluffs Picnic Area.

Buck Spring Lodge

This summer, the Foundation worked with individuals, community groups, and Parkway staff to place a new interpretive sign at the former site of Buck Spring Lodge, milepost 408. The panel shares the history of George W. Vanderbilt's Adirondack style hunting retreat, which was built in 1896 and enjoyed by family and friends for more than half a century.





Boone Fork Bridge

After careful planning and construction, the Boone Fork Bridge on the Mountains-to-Sea Trail now welcomes hikers. The 80-foot span provides a safe crossing over the waterway as the route turns north from the Boone Fork Trail in Julian Price Memorial Park. The project was a true collaboration between North Carolina State Parks, the Friends of the Mountains-to-Sea Trail, and the Foundation, which provided partial funding thanks to a grant from the John Wesley and Anna Hodgin Hanes Foundation.

Enhancing Visitor Experiences

Wildlife Cameras

This summer, the wildlife camera program grew from a Parkway staff initiative to a citizen science project with volunteers fanning out along the route. Thirty new cameras funded by our Community of Stewards made the expansion possible. Under the guidance of Natural Resource Specialist Tom Davis, nearly 20 volunteers were trained to install cameras in remote locations and identify the animals spied by the motiontriggered devices. The expanded effort will give park biologists a clearer picture of the species that call the park home and the role that humans play in influencing wildlife along the corridor.

Ramsey Cabin

Built in 1890, Ramsey Cabin at Humpback Rocks Farm, milepost 50, is an important link to the history of early Appalachian life. In late 2015, the single-crib log structure was outfitted with a new shake roof and is safe from further deterioration due to the elements. The repairs allow visitors to continue to explore the fascinating history of life in the mountains and learn from interpreters at the site.

Work in Progress!

The Park Service is making strides to reopen the building that formerly housed Bluffs Coffee Shop and Gift Shop at Doughton Park. The park unit secured \$100,000 and is remediating the mold in the structures. In spring 2017, Eastern National will open a Visitor Information Station and Store here. The Foundation is continuing its fundraising efforts to prepare for the next steps needed to welcome visitors back to this popular spot.





KIDS IN PARKS

Thousands of curious and adventurous kids set foot on their first TRACK Trail this year. Thousands more embraced that initial experience and headed out on their third, seventh, and even 18th hike. And while these excursions might just seem like family fun, the kids are reaping the benefits of building a stronger connection to nature, including improving their physical and mental well-being. In turn, the Kids in Parks program is setting a new generation on the path to becoming adults who cherish and value wild spaces and parks, including the Blue Ridge Parkway.

In 2016, Kids in Parks expanded in three main ways: growth of the trail network, new types of trail activities, and by working with health-care providers to write prescriptions that encourage young patients to hike TRACK Trails.

The Kids in Parks program is made up of 150 TRACK Trails in nine states and Washington, D.C. This year, 16 trails were added to the network in national parks, national forests, state parks, and a

variety of city/county parks, and in two new states: Tennessee and Wyoming.

Carl Sandburg Home National Historical Site in Flat Rock, North Carolina, now hosts the program's first Citizen Science TRACK Trail. It was designed to engage kids with the park in a fun and educational way. As children walk around the lake, a printed guide leads them to stations where they conduct scientific experiments and make observations about water quality, giving them a deeper insight into the science inherent in nature.

One of the most exciting accomplishments is the launch of the TRACK Rx program. Through this initiative, Kids in Parks partners with doctor offices and hospital systems to install health-related materials

in lobbies to promote nearby TRACK Trails. The doctors are also given prescription pads to prescribe TRACK Trails for the health of young patients. More than 50 doctors are enrolled and writing prescriptions, making it one of the largest Park Rx programs in the country.

With each new trail, activity, and initiative, Kids in Parks is making strides to improve children's health and guarantee the future stewardship of cherished landscapes.



Blue Ridge Music Center

A season of authentic and lively concerts, midday music sessions, a memorial music festival, dance lessons, and exhibits continued to showcase the Blue Ridge Music Center as a vibrant cultural destination for Parkway travelers and the greater community. The 2016 concert season marked the third year of programming support by the Foundation, aligning with the mission to preserve cultural heritage.

Summer shows welcomed beloved music veterans such as Carlene Carter, Bryan Sutton and his Bluegrass Band, Steep Canyon Rangers, Lonesome River Band, and The Virginia Luthiers, as well as rising talents Mipso, Bill and the Belles, The Church Sisters, Dori Freeman, Zoe & Cloyd, Shadowgrass, and Mason Via. Some of the best old-time mountain bands from across the Blue Ridge Mountains, including the Reed Island Rounders, Crooked Road Ramblers, Larry Sigmon & Martha Spencer, and Five Mile Mountain Road delighted audiences.

In September, A Show for Joe: The Joe Wilson Memorial Music Festival drew more than 2,000 traditional music fans to celebrate the life of Joe Wilson, who was instrumental in the creation of the Music Center and Roots of American Music Museum. The daylong event included workshops hosted by Virginia folklorist Jon Lohman and music jams. An incredible lineup took the stage in Wilson's honor, including Jerry Douglas, The Whites, Ricky Skaggs, Alison Krauss, Wayne Henderson & Friends, The Jeff Little Trio, Linda & David Lay with Sammy Shelor, Elizabeth LaPrelle, Phil Wiggins, The Barr Family, and Frank Newsome. Between songs, there were remembrances and stories about Wilson and his commitment to the Music Center. "Joe's heart and soul is here in this place. He fought hard for it," Skaggs said. "He knew the area needed a place like this."

Moses H. Cone Memorial Park & The Denim Ball

There is no other way to put it: 2016 was a big year for Moses H. Cone Memorial Park! The historic estate has long been a focus for donors, but earlier this year the Foundation made a commitment to remake history at the park near Blowing Rock, North Carolina, tackling wide-ranging repairs at Flat Top Manor and landscape needs on the 3,500-acre estate.

The first exciting announcement was a Centennial Challenge funding match from Congress to install a fire suppression system to protect Flat Top Manor. The matching program was created to address needs at parks across the country during the National Park Service's 100th year. The award allowed donors to double their impact for the project.

This summer, the Foundation created a map of the park to enhance visitors' understanding of the estate's history and the recreational opportunities on the grounds as well as what is at stake without support. With information about Moses and Bertha Cone, the former apple orchards, and the abundance of **Save the Date!** Join us for the second annual Denim Ball on August 4, 2017.

carriage trails and wildlife, the map paints a clearer picture of this treasured park's significance.

August brought the first annual Denim Ball fundraiser hosted by Chetola Resort at Blowing Rock. In a swell of support for the rehab efforts, nearly 200 guests enjoyed an evening of dinner, dancing, and auction bidding. The night also included the announcement of a matching challenge by an anonymous donor. Each donation designated for the former estate will be matched dollar for dollar if the \$300,000 goal is reached. The challenge is a monumental boost to the fundraising efforts.

Thanks to our Community of Stewards and support from the Blowing Rock community, we made a huge stride in the first year of a three-year plan to bring back much of the estate's former glory.

Remembering Landon Henry

B chind every honor and memorial gift, there is a heartfelt story. This year, we were moved when we learned about Landon Henry, who passed away in July at the age of 20. Growing up in Asheville, North Carolina, some of Landon's favorite activities were hiking the trails along the Blue Ridge Parkway and camping. "He was always in hiking boots," says his mom, Kate Henry. "He just loved the outdoors."

Landon went on to become a Boy Scout, and his mom recalls one of his most challenging excursions with the troop, a 62-mile trek over Cold Mountain in three days. From the time he could drive, he'd throw his camping gear in the car and head out into the woods with his friends.

For his senior project at Asheville High School, Landon focused on the history and future of trail maintenance. He researched the Appalachian Trail and the trails of the Blue Ridge Parkway, and visited with volunteers who clear and keep watch over the paths. During his outings with the

volunteers, Landon noticed there were very few young faces among the ranks. He pondered what that meant for the future of the trails he loved. Who would maintain them when the caretakers could no longer lift the tools, move the earth, and clear downed trees?

That's why his family, friends, and loved ones chose to honor Landon with memorial gifts that will be used to sustain the trails along the Blue Ridge Parkway and engage young volunteers in their upkeep.

"We feel so blessed we are in these mountains and every time we look at them we feel the presence of our son," Kate says. "His spirit lives on in these mountains."




