It's time to Find Your Pint!

Show your support for the Blue Ridge Parkway



A love for beer and the outdoors go hand in hand in the Blue Ridge Mountains. The Find Your Pint beer series celebrates that connection by raising funds to protect the Blue Ridge Parkway, the 469-mile scenic route from Shenandoah National Park to Great Smoky Mountains National Park. In 2016, more than 15 million people visited the Parkway, making it the second most visited national park unit. Unlike many large parks, the Parkway does not charge an admission fee, and with stagnant government funding, the Parkway requires extra support to keep it an amazing place.

How does it work?

This year, 30 breweries and one cidery are participating in Find Your Pint. Some are brewing special beers in honor of the Blue Ridge Parkway, while others are highlighting their flagship brews. Each brewery is generously donating a portion of sales to the Blue Ridge Parkway Foundation, the primary fundraising partner of the national park unit. All you need to do is come celebrate at each event, hosted in August and September, and raise a glass to show your appreciation for the Parkway (and exceptional beer, of course)!

How do I use the Parkway Beer Passport?

- The participating breweries are categorized by the four Blue Ridge Parkway districts: Ridge (milepost 0 to 106) and Plateau (milepost 106-216) in Virginia, and Highlands (milepost 216-305) and Pisgah (milepost 305-469) in North Carolina.
- Each time you visit a brewery, order the beer designated for the Parkway. Be sure to collect your passport sticker. You can also make tasting notes in the back of the booklet.
- While you're there, take a photo, and use #FindYourPint and tag the Blue Ridge Parkway Foundation to spread the word on Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram.

Sharp Top Shelter, Ridge District

This rock shelter built in 1858 by the Otter Peaks Hotel will be restored to host interpretive programs and provide a safe haven for hikers during the rapidly changing weather.



Mabry Mill, Plateau District

Repairs to a leaking flume will make sure the wheel keeps turning at Mabry Mill so grinding demonstrations continue at this historic, highly photographed stop.

Price Park Campground Showers, Highlands District

A new six-stall shower house will open later this summer at the popular 197-site campground, creating only the second such facility on the Blue Ridge Parkway.



Craggy Flats Bald Trail, Pisgah District

Heavy visitation has taken a toll on this trail, leading to erosion and damage to the habitat. This summer, an American Conservation Experience crew will repair the rutted route.
